The **Interstate 55 Birding Trail** features eight state parks which offer outstanding opportunities for bird observation. Interstate 55 is a major north/south corridor connecting New Orleans to Memphis, TN; St. Louis, MO; and Chicago, IL.

Traveling south from Memphis on Interstate 55, **John Kyle State Park** is located near the Sardis, MS, exit. Sardis Reservoir is one of three Corps of Engineers' reservoirs where great scenery and fishing abound. John Kyle State Park overlooking Sardis Reservoir has an RV campground, tent camping, lodge/convention center, cabins, group camp, swimming pool and destination golf course with golf villas. Mallard Pointe Golf Course is an 18-Hole Championship Golf Course designed by golf architect, Bob Cupp, with dramatic views of Sardis Reservoir.

Wall Doxey State Park near Holly Springs is east of Interstate 55 on Hwy. 7 South. Wall Doxey is one of the original ten CCC state parks in MS. This scenic park includes a stone visitor/activity building, cabins, RV campground, tent camping, group camp, disc golf and fishing lake.

George Cossar State Park, adjacent to Interstate 55, is located on Enid Reservoir. Facilities include cabins, RV campground, visitor's center, restaurant, group camp, disc golf and swimming pool. Great fishing, boating, and dining are available at Cossar State Park.

Hugh White State Park, located on Grenada Reservoir, is our next stop traveling south. The park is accessible on Highway 8 and includes a visitor/activity building, cabins, RV campground, tent camping, group camp and golf course. The 18-hole Championship Golf Course was recognized by *Golf Digest* in January 2008 as the 5th best, new, public golf course in the U.S. This outstanding golf course was designed by golf architect, Gary Roger Baird.

Holmes County State Park, adjacent to Interstate 55, is one of ten original CCC state parks in MS. Facilities include cabins, RV campground, tent camping, group camp, scenic lake and nature trails. The lake provides excellent boating and fishing activities.

Interstate 55 extends through Jackson, MS, where **LeFleur's Bluff State Park** is located at the Lakeland Drive exit. This 300 acre state park includes an RV campground, scenic lake, 9-hole LeFleur's Bluff Golf Course with Driving Range and golf villas. LeFleur's Bluff is home to the MS Museum of Natural Science, a state-of-the-art, destination facility with numerous fish aquariums, natural science exhibits, and nature trails.

Traveling Interstate 55 south from Jackson, **Lake Lincoln State Park** is located near Brookhaven. Facilities include an RV campground, tent camping, cabin, large lake, nature trail and disc golf. Boating and fishing are popular on this scenic lake.

The Interstate 55 Birding Trail concludes with **Percy Quin State Park**, one of the ten original CCC parks in MS. This scenic state park has an abundance of facilities including cabins, RV campground, tent campground, group camp, visitor/activity building, motel, convention center, large fishing lake, swimming pool, tennis, golf course and golf villas. Quail Hollow Golf Course was designed by golf architect, Arthur Hills. This 18-hole Championship Golf Course was listed in *Golf Digest* upon opening as one of the ten best new, public golf courses in the U.S.

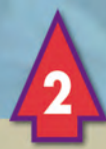
